## **Reduced Taxes on Vegetative Filter Strips**

The Vegetative Filter Strip Assessment Law, passed by the state of Illinois in 1997, provides tax incentives for vegetative filter strips. A "vegetative filter strip," will be valued at 1/6th of its productivity index equalized assessed value as cropland if it meets the requirements of the law and is certified by the soil and water conservation district.

This voluntary program applies to land that is located between a farm field and an area to be protected, including but not limited to surface water, a stream, a river, or a sinkhole. To qualify, the land must also meet the following:

- Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) standards and specifications
- Uniform ground cover
- Heavy fibrous root system
- Tolerant to field pesticides
- Conservation plan created and on file in SWCD office

Interested landowners must request assistance of the Soil and Water Conservation District for either developing or implementing a conservation plan, or in certifying an existing vegetative filter strip. The landowner must file the signed certification form with the County Supervisor of Assessments.

# Visit the SWCD Cover Crop Demo Plot

The plots are just west of the junction of 176th Ave (County Road NN) and 63rd St

A cover crop demonstration plot, pictured above, has been seeded on farmland just east of the Sherrard High School FFA plots. Ten combinations of cover crops were seeded on September 14th using Annual Ryegrass, Oil Seed Radishes, Cereal Rye, Turnips, Crimson Clover, Rapeseed, Oats, and others. Combination plot seed was donated by C.D. Ford and Sons of Geneseo. The farmer, Scott Cocquit, chopped ten acres of silage which was immediately seeded to Cereal Rye on October 3rd. Across the road, 50 acres of Cereal Rye was aerially seeded into standing corn on October 2<sup>nd</sup>. Cattle have grazed the area.

Cover crops are used to reduce soil erosion, improve soil health, increase organic matter, reduce soil compaction, and reduce weed competition. Different cover crop seeds have different purposes, so finding the right combination for you is the purpose of the plots. Farmers can sign-up for cost-sharing assistance to seed cover crops in 2014 through NRCS' Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP). Application cut-off dates are: January 17th, March 21st, and May 16th.
